


Locating Full Text Articles and Journals

GET AN ARTICLE FROM A CITATION

When you already have a citation to an article, copy/paste the article **DOI** (digital object identifier) into **OneSearch** on the library homepage (<https://www.uhcl.edu/library>). If there's no DOI, search instead for a distinctive phrase from the article title. If there are too many results, add the author's last name (e.g., "religion paradox" diener).



GET AN ARTICLE FROM DATABASE SEARCH RESULTS


If a research database lacks immediate full text, click the **Find It @ UHCL** link in results to check OneSearch for a full text source for UH Clear Lake users.

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

On the library homepage, choose **Journals** in the center search options, and enter the name of the journal or magazine.


